Pastor Katie's Message

March 2nd is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is a spiritual season of journeying to the cross on Good Friday and the empty tomb on Easter Sunday. It is often a time where people will give up things like certain foods or even nonfood things like media consumption. By fasting from these things they then instead direct their time and thoughts toward God. Many people also use this season of Lent as a time to take on a new spiritual practice. This Lent we will be learning about various spiritual practices to help us grow in our relationship with Christ.

In our relationships with people, we have better relationships with people the more time we spend with them. The same is true with our relationship with God. We will feel closer to God the more time we spend with God. And just like with people, we have different ways of communicating - text, email, phone call, Facetime, sending a card, spending time in person or doing an activity together. All of these things help us in our relationships with people. And similarly, this can be said of our relationship with God. Different spiritual practices help us to be open to hearing from God. Some of these spiritual practices are prayer, meditation, silence, solitude, service, Bible Study, worship, confession, fasting and many more. These practices are often referred to as a "means of grace." It is a means by which we can open ourselves up to God to experience God's grace in our lives. These practices are not the end goal in and of themselves. They are simply a means to help us get to that end goal of knowing and loving the Lord more deeply.

So as we journey together this Lenten Season discovering different Spiritual Practices, I

encourage all of us to try different ones, to see which ones help us grow in our relationship with Christ.

We will find that some of us connect better with the Lord through different spiritual practices. That is ok. It's good for us to discover whatever personally helps us to grow in our relationship with Christ. In scripture we see Jesus himself using these spiritual practices to meet with his Father. So if Jesus himself used these practices to commune with his Father, why wouldn't we think we should as well?
